Intelligence Joint Cross-Service Group
Meeting Minutes of November 17, 2004

The Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Intelligence (G2), United States Army, Mr. Terrance Ford led this meeting. The list of attendees is attached (Attachment 1). These minutes reference slides from the briefing to the IJCSG Principals dated November 17, 2004. The briefing is classified and is held at the Technical Integration Center for review by individuals with appropriate clearances and who have the authority and responsibility to view BRAC material.

Mr. Ford opened the twenty fifth meeting of the IJCSG and asked Ms. Dunie to proceed with the briefing. Ms. Dunie began with an update on capacity analysis. She explained that the Core Team was concerned that the initial outputs may distort the true current capacity for intelligence functions that relate directly to personnel. If the criteria is adjusted to exclude facilities that are not used to house people e.g. ammo bunkers, warehouses, etc., a more actual representation of defense intelligence capacity would result. The Principals agreed that the Core Team should initiate action to breakout the facilities by agency/building type and then provide an adjusted capacity number.

Next, Ms. Dunie addressed military value. The initial run on the data that created a list of buildings arrayed from one-to-N by military value appeared to be representative of the scoring plan. The Core Team will analyze the scores associated with these activities/buildings before providing a final list to the IJCSG for review.

The Principals next reviewed the future force structure numbers. There was considerable discussion concerning how to account for contractors. The Principals agreed the current numbers be reviewed by the agencies and military departments

and be displayed in two categories: worldwide and CONUS. The agencies and military departments should supply this information through their Core Team member as soon as possible. The Principals next discussed potential conflicting scenarios. [REDACTED] reported that there were currently no scenarios in the ISG Tracking Tool that impacted special access programs.

Next, a general discussion pertaining to the consolidation of activities in Hawaii ensued. The NSA representative again reiterated their opposition to the integration of JICPAC with the new RSOC at Wahiawa due to concerns that it would negatively impact their existing plans for the site. Additionally, questions remain concerning:

- Buildable acres at the Wahiawa site – adjacent to or an addition onto the current planned RSOC facility
- Disposition of the current RSOC site at Kunia
- JICPAC's true intentions on the proposal for integration
- Army's intentions to backfill the current RSOC site

The Chair requested the Army and NSA representatives discuss these issues and report back to the IJCSG at its next meeting in December.

Mr. Ford next asked the Army member to lead a classified discussion on Army intelligence scenarios numbers #0049, #0050, and #0060 which are presently unclassified in the ISG Tracking Tool. The Principals agreed that they have interest in these scenarios and would like to be periodically briefed as to their status. Additionally, the Army representative asked for a written commitment from the Chair, IJCSG that the Defense Geospatial-Intelligence School will be a part of the NGA East Coast Campus consolidation. Mr. Howard took this task for action.

The Navy representative then raised the issue of the potential for closure of Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base, Ft. Worth and the subsequent impact on the existing JRIC located on that installation. There followed a discussion on who would be responsible for generating and analyzing an enabling scenario that would

move or retain in place the JRIC. The Principals agreed it would be appropriate for the DIA Core Team member to take the lead and generate the new scenario(s).

Lastly, based on the graphic display of the island of Oahu, the Principals deferred the Army BRAC office request for a decision on the movement of the Army 500th MI Group. The Core Team was directed to create a slide that indicated all the pending moves of Army intelligence personnel on Oahu. With this information, the IJCSG will discuss the Army proposed 500th MI Group scenario at the next IJCSG meeting.

Ms. Dunie concluded the briefing with a discussion on the future schedule of the Core Team and IJCSG in support of BRAC 2005. She asked the Principals to block their schedules for the same time of the week through May 2005. Ms. Dunie also advised the group that until the candidate recommendations are forwarded to the ISG, there may be a requirement for more frequent meetings and/or longer meetings. In addition, the Core Team can expect to work BRAC issues through this time frame.

Mr. Ford concluded the meeting thanking everyone for their excellent work. The next IJCSG will be December 1, 2004.


