


Homeland Security and Emergency Management

When Disaster Strikes

Idaho's emergency response and recovery capability is founded on:

- Local First Responders (Self Help)
- Local Emergency Plans
- Idaho Emergency Operations Plan
 - Emergency Support Functions (ESF)
 - Hazard Specific Plans
- National Response Plan
 - National Incident Management System (NIMS)
 - Incident Command System (ICS)

When Disaster Strikes

- Idaho has embraced the HSPD-5
 - Idaho Plans to be updated to interface with the NRP
 - State will be adopting NIMS and the ICS by Executive Order
- 1994 - first attempt to adopt ICS as a state standard
- Currently, all BHS emergency response and recovery teams use an ICS organization format
- We have modified the IDEOC organization to reflect an Area Command Organizational Structure.
 - Plans, Logistics and Finance/Administration
 - No Operations Section (Field Operations)

State Agency Emergency Coordinating Working Group

- Ten Year Old
- Meets monthly in the IDEOC
- Each department/agency director designates a representative to be an emergency coordinator and participate in the working group
- Single points of contact for agency coordination
- We are on a first name basis
