MEMORANDUM FOR DIRECTOR, OSD BRAC OFFICE

SUBJECT: Department of the Navy Comments on ISG Meeting Minutes

Per the DUSD (I&E) tasking memo of 6 May, the following comments are provided on the two sets of minutes for ISG meetings held on 9 and 23 April 2004:

9 April attendees

Page 2, 7th bullet under Others – Delete one “Mr.” before “David Steensma.”

9 April minutes

Page 1, paragraph 3, line 11 – Do not agree with the wording “fundamentally disagreed with the one score plan approach.” Recommend rewording the sentence by striking the noted language and changing “questioning” to “questioned.”

Page 1, paragraph 4, line 7 – Recommend replacing “and that” with “since” for correctness.

Page 2, paragraph 1, line 1 – Place a period after “operations” and start a new sentence with “Future” for clarity.

Page 2, paragraph 1, line 5 – Place the word “the” before “facilities” for completeness.

Page 2, paragraph 2, lines 3-5 - Replace words “ inappropriate because it would effectively alter intelligence “force-structure”, and that is not the job of BRAC” with the words “outside the scope of BRAC.”

23 April minutes

Page 1, paragraph 3, 1st bullet – I am concerned that there is confusion on what was actually decided. Some members believe that the Services were to work the platform issues independent of the E&T sub-groups.

Page 1, paragraph 3, 2nd bullet – There is also uncertainty with the reporting of the groups mentioned above. Some members believe the decision was for the groups to report directly to the ISG.

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Page 1, paragraph 3, 5th bullet – I believe that a review of C12 was eliminated. It is unclear, however, where the analysis of C12 training will occur (Services or JCSG)

Page 3, paragraph 2, line 5 – Change the word “utility” to “ability” for correctness.

Page 3, paragraph 3, lines 5-6 – Recommend rewording the sentence for correctness as follows, “Mr. Potochney proceeded to explain the JPAT approach to categorize environmental data collected in Data Call 1 into ten resource areas (e.g. air quality, dredging, and noise).”

Page 3, paragraph 4, line 7 – Add the words “to current use” before the word “regardless” for correctness.
