Supplemental SDC for Fort Meade:

1. Are there at least 150 contiguous buildable acres on Fort Meade? If so, are there any wetland restrictions, building height restrictions or any other restrictions on developing the land? Is the land located in the flight path of Baltimore-Washington International Airport?

**Answer: We are in the process of conducting a study on how to relocate our Golf Course to the Landfill area. Resources for this project are undetermined at this time. BRAC could be the vehicle to accomplish this action.**

**The entire site (Golf Course area) is about 380 acres or so and does contain wetlands and other areas that may not be suitable for development (habitat, forests, areas of substantial slope, etc) but that the end result would be more than 150 acres of contiguous buildable acres.**

**This area is not within the BWI flight path that we are aware.**

**The height limit for new facilities, per our current Installation Design Guide is 4 stories. There is nothing which limits the height of the building other than our current IDG. Also, our master plan calls for parking garages instead of parking lots.**

**Question #1** – In evaluating the closure of Reston 1, 2 and 3 what considerations were made for existing leases?

**Answer:** When NGA evaluated the Reston leases we considered the early termination costs associated with vacating the Reston 1 and Reston 2 facilities. Reston 3 is under construction. NGA included a one-time unique cost to terminate our agreement with the Lockheed Martin Corporation, under whom NGA occupies these facilities, in the COBRA evaluation. The NGA certified data includes a termination cost of \$24,000,000 if NGA were to vacate Reston on 30 September 2010. This data was provided and certified by the NGA.

**Question #2** – Do the Reston facilities presently comply with DoD Uniform Facilities Criteria?

**Answer:** The NGA Reston facilities do not presently comply with the Uniform Facilities Criteria, specifically "DoD Minimum Anti-Terrorism Standards for Buildings," UFC 4-010-01. This standard requires a set-back from the site's controlled perimeter of 148-feet for unreinforced structures and 82-feet for reinforced structures. Neither the Reston 1 nor the Reston 2 facilities meet this standard; the new facility, Reston 3, which is under construction will meet this standard. This data was provided and certified by the NGA.

**Question #3** – Is the Cobra data for the scenario of NGA locating to Ft. Meade classified? If not, please include a copy of the COBRA run.

**Answer:** This COBRA run will be classified. This classified data is expected to be reviewed with the appropriately cleared Commission personnel in its upcoming visit.

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Joseph Composto  
Director, Security and Installation Operations Directorate

Joseph Composto is the Director of the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency's Security and Installation Operations Directorate.

He retired as a brigadier general from the Marine Corps in 2003, after a 32-year career. His last military assignment was as Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Quantico, Va.

BGen Composto was commissioned via the Marine Corps Platoon Leader's Course at St. John's University, New York, N.Y., in June 1971. Receiving his Bachelor of Arts degree in history, BGen Composto also earned a Juris Doctor degree from St. John's University Law School (1974). He also received a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College, Newport, R.I. (1991). After graduating with honors from both the Basic School, Quantico, Va., and the Naval Justice School, Newport, R.I., he was designated a Marine Corps Judge Advocate in October 1975.

Following the Basic School, he served with the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing, Marine CAS, El Toro, Calif. as a trial counsel, defense counsel, review officer and chief review officer from May 1975 to April 1978. BGen Composto transferred to Okinawa, Japan, where he served as a review officer, trial counsel and Head, International and Administrative Law Branch.

Upon returning from Okinawa, he attended Amphibious Warfare School, Quantico, Va., from August 1979 to May 1980. After graduating, he remained at Quantico, where he served in the Staff Judge Advocate's Office until July 1982 as a trial counsel and as head of the Civil Law Branch. BGen Composto was next assigned to the Judge Advocate Division, Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps, as Assistant Branch Head, Legal Support Branch until April 1985. He was transferred to Officer Candidates School, Quantico, Va., as a company commander until his reassignment in August 1985 as a student at the Marine Corps Command and Staff College, Quantico, Va.

In August 1986, he was assigned to 1st Marine Amphibious Brigade, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii, as Deputy Staff Judge Advocate. From June 1987 to May 1989, BGen Composto served as the Operations Officer of Brigade Service Support Group-1, 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade.

In July 1989, he was transferred to 3rd Force Service Support Group, Okinawa, Japan, as the Staff Judge Advocate. In August 1990, he attended the Naval War College, Newport, R.I., graduating with distinction in June 1991. From July 1991 to August 1994, he was assigned to the Judge Advocate Division, Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps as the head of the Research and Civil Law Branch, and then as Deputy Director. From August 1994 to May 1995 he served as the Head of the Appellate Government Division of the Navy and Marine



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Corps Appellate Review Activity, Washington, D.C. From June 1995 until July 1996, BGen Composto served as the Commanding Officer, Marine Barracks, Ground Defense/Security Force, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

He then served as the Deputy Director, Judge Advocate Division, Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps, from August 1996 until September 1, 1999, when he was promoted to his present grade. From September of 1999 to June 2001, BGen Composto was the Staff Judge Advocate to the Commandant of the Marine Corps. On June 21, 2001, he assumed his duties as Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Quantico, Va.

His medals and decorations include: Distinguished Service Medal; Legion of Merit with gold star in lieu of second award; Meritorious Service Medal with gold star in lieu of second award; Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal; Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal; Humanitarian Service Medal; and the National Defense Service Medal.
