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**Supply & Storage Joint Cross-Service Group
Transformational Options
BRAC 2005**

1. Establish a multi-service supply, storage and distribution system that enhances the strategic deployment and sustainment of expeditionary joint forces worldwide. Focus the analysis on creating joint activities in heavy (CONUS) DoD concentration areas. i.e., locations where more than one Department is based and within close proximity to another.
2. Consider the total outsourcing of the wholesale storage and distribution processes from DoD activities that perform these functions.
3. Consider migrating all service depot level reparable to the oversight and management of a single DoD agency/activity.

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
