JCSG) PRINCIPALS

SUBJECT: Risk and Reward Analysis

During our recent meetings of the S&S JCSG, we have discussed the need to develop a risk and reward capability to facilitate our ability to make recommendations to the Infrastructure Steering Group. I believe that this capability, if properly developed, can be used by all levels of the Department of Defense decision makers involved in the Base Realignment and Closure process.

I am pleased to report that, with the support of the most senior levels within the Logistics Management Institute (LMI), LMI is aggressively working to develop a risk assessment mechanism to help us evaluate warfighter impact associated with our potential recommendations.

To make this effort a success, I ask each of you to identify a flag-level officer to participate in a one day session with LMI on November 16, 2004, here in the Washington metro area. In addition, LMI is committing a senior level asset, a retired flag officer, to round out the group. Your flag officers will be answering a variety of survey questions relative to logistics support to the warfighter. Responses will be central to the proposed risk analysis and full flag participation is a must!
