The closure of Cannon would also have a disastrous affect on the economy of a large area surrounding us as well as our immediate communities. Losing Cannon would be extremely devastating to many of our businesses and even more catastrophic to the enrollment in our public and university education systems. Since we are not in an easily accessible industrial area, it is hard to attract new businesses, and I feel that our economic survival is as important as any other part of the country.

I pray that you will carefully reconsider all of these important facts before making your final decision.
