

Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)
between
Technical Joint Cross Service Group (TJCSG)
and
Education and Training Joint Cross Service Group (E&T JCSG)
For
Ranges Subgroup

1. REFERENCES:

- a. Chairman, Infrastructure Steering Group Memorandum, Subject: BRAC 2005 Guidance for the Technical Joint Cross-Service Group (JCSG), dated 16 Jul 2003.
- b. Chairman, Infrastructure Steering Group Memorandum, Subject: BRAC 2005 Guidance for the Education and Training Joint Cross-Service Group (JCSG), dated 16 Jul 2003.

2. BACKGROUND: In executing the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) 2005 process, the Infrastructure Steering Group (ISG) recommended that a Ranges Subgroup be formed under the lead of the Education and Training JCSG to address range functions, including testing and training and collective training, references a. and b. The ISG also recommended that the Ranges Subgroup have members from and be supported by the Technical and the Education and Training JCSGs.

3. PURPOSE: This MOA establishes the responsibilities regarding the interactions between the TJCSG and the E&T JCSG regarding the Ranges Subgroup of the E&T JCSG.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Ranges Subgroup, being responsible for addressing the optimum capacity and capabilities of ranges and simulation centers that could be used for joint test, training and experimentation, will report to the E&T JCSG and shall coordinate all efforts with the TJCSG. Specifically, the Ranges Subgroup will:

- a. Support the needs and objectives of both the E&T JCSG and the TJCSG.
- b. Provide questions, metrics, attributes, and candidate scenarios in a timely manner to allow each JCSG to review and utilize all products where necessary, to support the requirements of both JCSGs.

The TJCSG and the E&T JCSG will conduct its capacity, military value, and scenario development processes per their respective approved charters, with input from the Ranges Subgroup as required.

Specifically, the JCSGs will:

c. Use existing coordination protocols between their respective Integration Teams to ensure their scenario development and analysis activities are compatible and that complementary recommendations for any realignment of DOD RDT&E and training infrastructure, including air/land/sea space range infrastructure, will meet the future defense force structure plan.

d. The TJCSG will provide representatives to participate as members on the Ranges Subgroup at two levels

- SES/GO Steering Group (deputy to training lead)
- Working Group (four members - deputy to training lead and one representative from each service)

5. COMMUNICATIONS: All communications/documentations will be in accordance with established BRAC 2005 directives. Disagreements and conflicts resulting from proposed documentation will be reconciled by the JCSGs' Integration teams. Disputes that can not be resolved within the Ranges Subgroup will be for the Integration Teams of the two JCSGs to resolve. If the matter cannot be resolved between the E&T JCSG and TJCSG principals, it will be elevated to the ISG for arbitration and resolution.


6. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The chair of the Ranges Subgroup will provide all of the above products to the TJCSG as required.

7. TERMS OF THE UNDERSTANDING/AGREEMENT: This document is effective upon signature of both parties and expires on 30 June 2005.

8. PROVISIONS FOR REVIEW AND CHANGE: This MOA will be reviewed by the both E&T JCSG and TJCSG principals as required.
