MEMORANDUM FOR MILITARY DEPARTMENT INFRASTRUCTURE STEERING GROUP MEMBERS

SUBJECT: Analysis of Ranges During BRAC 2005

On October 10, 2003, the Education and Training Joint Cross-Service Group (JCSG) chairman briefed the Infrastructure Steering Group (ISG) on his group's approach to capacity analysis for ranges. The ISG members agreed that the Military Departments would recommend those specific classified ranges that should be considered by the Education and Training JCSG. All other classified ranges will be considered by the Military Departments.

I request that you recommend to the Education and Training JCSG chairman, within 60 days, those classified ranges that should receive JCSG analysis, with the understanding that you will be responsible for analyzing the remaining classified ranges as appropriate. Please provide copies of your correspondence with the JCSG to Mr. Peter Potochney, Director, OSD BRAC.
