SUBJECT: BRAC 2005 Military Value Principles--ACTION MEMORANDUM

1. Purpose: To recommend concurrence on the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) 2005 Military Value Principles to the Infrastructure Executive Council (IEC).
2. Discussion:
 - a. The BRAC ISG has deliberated and recommends the BRAC 2005 Military Value Principles listed on the attached memorandum from the Chairman of the Infrastructure Executive Council.
 - b. The principles are few in number and broadly written to enumerate the essential elements of military judgment to be applied to the BRAC process.
 - c. The principles are similar to those submitted initially by the Army, are consistent with the principles approved by the Army BRAC SRG. The principles are unobjectionable and serve our purpose for analysis.
 - d. Concurrence with this report will enable the ISG, JCSGs and Military Departments to continue developing imperatives that flow from the principles and ensure that quantitative analysis doesn't produce results that are detrimental to essential military capabilities.
3. Coordination: G-3, G-8
4. Recommendation: That the Secretary of the Army and the Chief of Staff Army sign the attached memorandum to Under Secretary of Defense at Tab A.
