
SUBJECT: Certification of Installation Data and Information for BRAC 2005

I have reviewed the Air Force Real Property Agency's operations and have determined that some operational efficiency can be gained if the Agency were to be co-located with the Air Force Center for Environmental Excellence at Brooks City-Base San Antonio, Texas.


At a minimum, I project a savings of 10 manpower positions can be saved from the current AFRPA organization through this relocation effort. The justification for this analysis is as follows:

As the AFCEE provides environmental remediation services for the Air Force, parallel consistency in program management, NEPA documentation, technology R&D applications, and contracting oversight and support will generate efficiencies.

As the AFCEE provides comprehensive installation planning and development for the Air Force, and the AFRPA handles the disposal of excess and utilization of underutilized properties, there is a synergy of support efforts in maximizing the effectiveness of the remaining installation infrastructure.

The AFRPA can utilize the resources of the existing AFCEE Geo Integration Division, in implementing this technology in management of the BRAC installations prior to transfer.
