SECRETARY OF DEFENSE RECOMMENDATION:

None. The Commission voted to add an analysis of DoD post graduate education activities, to include the Naval Post Graduate School, the Defense Language Institute, and the Air Force Institute of Technology. This base visit was a result of that add.

SECRETARY OF DEFENSE JUSTIFICATION:

MAIN FACILITIES REVIEWED:

Naval Post Graduate School:

After briefings and discussions in the main conference room, the commissioners toured the campus, including stops at several classrooms and research facilities.

Defense Language Institute:

After briefings and discussions in the command conference room, the commissioners toured the installation and made stops in several different language training offices and classrooms.

KEY ISSUES IDENTIFIED

1. The Defense Language Institute is not involved in post-graduate level instruction.
2. DLI could expand its BASOPS operation to include the NPS campus.
3. Moving either school to a new location would risk serious degradation in their programs.

INSTALLATION CONCERNS RAISED

1. NPS sees no efficiencies to be gained by consolidating the BASOPS functions of DLI and NPS under a single command.
2. Movement of either school will seriously degrade vital defense programs in language and in research.

COMMUNITY CONCERNS RAISED:

1. Moving either school will have significant economic impact for the Monterey area.
2. If NPS is moved an exclave should be provided for Fleet Numerical and NRL activities.
