Subj: JOINT CROSS SERVICE GROUPS (JCSG) ANALYSIS WITHIN
BRAC 2005

1. Recommend you approve the functions and metrics for the JCSGs as forwarded in the DEPSECDEF Memorandum of 22 April 03 (Attachment 1).
2. The framework for the JCSGs have been worked within our Navy Infrastructure Evaluation Group (IEG), chaired by DASN (IA) with VADM Konetzni and myself as members, for the past several weeks. We played a role in the make-up of each JCSG, as well as, assigning leadership for each group. The JCSGs met individually to determine specific functions to be examined including analytical agenda. A constructive dialog with good interaction was achieved among all the groups.
3. After a satisfactory review by our IEG, the recommendations were presented and approved with minor modifications by the Infrastructure Steering Group (ISG), chaired by USD (AT&L), with the VCNO as our service representative.

PURPOSE: To inform the Acting Secretary of the Navy of
Marine Corps recommendations regarding the subject report.

DISCUSSION: Reference (a) forwarded the subject report to
all members of the Infrastructure Executive Council (IEC)
for review and concurrence. The report was prepared in
response to reference (b) direction for the Infrastructure
Steering Group (ISG) to identify and recommend to the IEC
functions, which should receive joint cross-service
analysis. To accomplish this task, the ISG established six
Joint Cross-Service Groups to develop recommendations on
specific functions for review, organizational structure for
performing analysis and notional metrics for evaluation.
On 4 April 2003, the ISG reviewed these recommendations,
and with slight modifications, approved each JCSG report
for forwarding to the IEC.

I have been briefed by my staff on the content of this
report and concur in its recommendations.
