Dear Chairman Principi:

This is a response to the August 11, 2005 (CWF #11) inquiry from Mr. Frank Cirillo of your staff concerning the difference between Battle Force Ships between Volume IV of the DOD Base Closure and Realignment Report to the Commission of May 2005 and the "Interim Report to Congress on Annual Long-Range Plan For The Construction of Naval Vessels For FY2006" submitted by the Secretary of the Navy on 23 March 2005. The question and our response are provided below:

Please verify the number of Battle Force Ships in the current Force Structure Plan for FY05 through FY11.

The table below identifies the number of Battle Force Ships in the Revised FSP and the Interim SBP by Fiscal Year for the FYDP. The Interim SBP does not account for the following ship classes: PC (Patrol Craft), MPS (Maritime Prepositioning Ships), T-AH (Hospital Ships), and T-AVB (Aviation Maintenance Logistics Ships). The difference between the two submissions as shown below is due to the fact that these four ship classes are not contained in the Interim SBP. Additionally, the interim SBP does not include FY05.
