SUBJECT: Review of BRAC Candidate Recommendations (CRs)

Sierra Army Depot. HQDA G4, the Army Materiel Command, and TABs are currently evaluating future storage requirements for Brigade Combat Team sets, Army Prepositioned Stocks, and Operational Project Stocks returning from Korea and Germany. Analysis will be completed by 16 March. We expect to brief results to ISG on 25 March.

Red River Army Depot. The Army is currently preparing a Candidate Recommendation for the closure of Red River Army Depot. TABS is awaiting Candidate Recommendation and COBRA results from S&S JCSG for the relocation of the Strategic Distribution Platform and Industrial JCSG Candidate Recommendation that includes construction of new capacity. We will try to submit CR on 18 March.

Fort Monmouth. TABS coordinated with the S&S JCSG on 10 March to relocate the ICP to Aberdeen Proving Grounds. This will enable the ICP to remain with the Life Cycle Management Command. TABS will integrate these CRs when integration phase begins.

Rock Island Arsenal. TABS is awaiting results from the IJCSG on their analysis of relocating armament manufacturing functions. If the IJCSG relocates the armament functions from Rock Island Arsenal, it will enable the Army to develop a Candidate Recommendation to close Rock Island Arsenal. TABS will try to submit CR 25 March.

Soldier Systems Center Natick. TABS coordinated with Army representatives from the Technical and S&S JCSG to relocate the ICP to APG. This will enable the ICP to remain with the Life Cycle Management Command that it is a part of. TABS is assessing whether we must submit a “Close Natick” CR or finish this work during integration.

Fort Knox. Fort Knox is the best choice for the Human Resources Command, the 100th Division (institutional training) from Louisville, and a Support UA that the Army will undertake outside the BRAC process. Fort Knox also has high Military Value (Ranked 12th of 87 installations). It processes mobilization/surge capacity and houses the US Gold Reserve. TABS expect to brief results to ISG on 25 March.

Fort Huachuca. The E&T JCSG has the lead for the Candidate Recommendations involving Fort Huachuca. It has high Military Value (Ranked 21st of 87 installations). It would require an enclave for the activities listed below, which utilize approximately 10% of the facilities on the installation and a majority of the range capacity.

- Joint Interoperability Test Command
- Thunder Mountain Evaluation Center
- Intel Electronic Warfare Test Directorate
- Electronic Proving Ground

USAF tells us they, too, will require Fort Huachuca for UAV flight training.

NWSC Crane. TABS and Army Materiel Command coordinated with the Navy to determine what BASOPS support the Army would need to retain if Navy transfers title to the Army. Crane Army Ammunition Activity occupies 80% of NWSC Crane. The Army can not vacate NWSC Crane because of the munitions production mission. It also serves as a strategic platform for munitions out load and storage.
