EDUCATION AND TRAINING JOINT CROSS-SERVICE GROUP
MEETING MINUTES OF OCTOBER 7, 2004

The Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (Readiness), Dr. Paul Mayberry, presided over the 27th meeting of the E&T JCSG as acting chair. Attendee list is at Attachment 1. Dr. Mayberry opened the meeting by welcoming all participants. He then expressed the requirement for each of the Subgroups to “create a detailed record” that would make available the logic used within the Subgroups for proposals sent forward to the Principals for deliberative active (approval/disapproval). He noted that in today’s deliberations (and in the future), the Subgroup Chairs must be prepared to provide the justification used in making the proposal and the recommendations for the gaining and losing installations. Subgroups should not rely solely on military judgment if capacity and military value data are available for analysis.

Mr. Howlett provided an overview of the meeting agenda and asked key participants to ensure their calendars are annotated since participation is crucial to the timely review and approval of Subgroup proposals. He also reminded the principals that E&T JCSG meetings are now weekly, but more frequent meetings will probably be needed in order to review and approve scenarios to meet ISG deadlines. Mr. Howlett then reported the status of E&T JCSG Requests for Clarification (RFCs) by Service (and DOD Agencies). Services are working to diligently to clarify/correct capacity information for E&T JCSG Subgroups and have made some progress. In addition, he noted that OSD BRAC met earlier in the week with representatives of the Subgroups to identify and correct incidences in which the Services have submitted data to OSD, but process issues have delayed/prohibited getting the information to the JCSG. Dr. Mayberry reiterated the importance to the Service Reps the end-game requirement to “zero” down the RFC numbers as soon as possible, and asked subgroups to articulate any support required from Mr. Abell to assist them in this process.

The remainder of the meeting was devoted to Flight Training (RADM Mayer), Professional Development Education (CAPT Osman), Specialized Skill Training (Brig Gen Hostage), and Ranges (Dr. Foulkes) presentations of proposals for JCSG consideration and approval. E&T JCSG comments and decisions are annotated on the attached briefing slides. (Attachment 2)

The next meeting of the E&T JCSG is scheduled for October 14, 2004.



Establish Western T&E OAR Complex

Proposal

- Consolidate T&E capabilities and workload requiring open-air ranges for T&E to a western U.S. complex of ranges for air, sea and land combat, armament/munitions, C4ISR, EC, and CB Defense.
- Gaining Locations:** Edwards AFB, China Lake, Pt Mugu, PMRF, Vandenberg AFB, Nellis AFB, UTTR (Hill AFB), DPG, YPG, Ft. Huachuca, WSMR.
- Losing Locations:** Patuxent River, Eglin AFB, Redstone Arsenal, Ft. Rucker, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Ellsworth AFB, Shaw AFB, McConnell AFB, Buckley AFB, Luke AFB, Selfridge ANGB, Tucson IAP AGS, Ft. A.P. Hill, Ft. Belvoir, Ft. Bragg, Ft. Eustis, Ft. Hood, Ft. Drivers(D)/Assumptions(A)

- (D) Operate as a joint capability under executive agent or multi-service management.

- (A) Difficult/expensive to replace/unique capabilities at existing sites should be retained.

Justification/Impact

- Enhances system-of-system test capability in a joint environment.
- Reduces T&E footprint to provide increased training utilization opportunity.
- Minimizes duplication of OAR equipment, manning and instrumentation.
- Fosters interoperability while providing capabilities required for T&E reliance area(s).

Potential Conflicts

- Associated technical activities should be collocated. Coordination w/TJCSG required.
- Movement of T&E capacity/usage will affect training capacity/usage. Coordination w/training range subgroup required.
- May need to retain geographically separated specialty capabilities for mission and/or climatic test capability.
- Non-collocation of operational units for operational testing.

Consolidate Air Vehicle T&E to a Geographically-Centered T&E OAR Footprint

Proposal

- Consolidate T&E OAR capabilities and workload for manned and unmanned air vehicle and associated avionics, propulsion, airframes at a single site or contiguous/near contiguous sites.
- Potentially impacted locations:** Edwards AFB, China Lake, Pt Mugu, Patuxent River, Ft Rucker, Eglin AFB, Redstone Arsenal.
- Consolidation of subsets of fixed- and rotary-wing vehicles and unmanned air vehicles may be independently analyzed.

Drivers(D)/Assumptions(A)

- (D) Operate as a joint capability under executive agent or multi-service management.
- (D) Promote and support systems “born joint.”
- (D) Support “cross-Service utilization” and “joint management” transformation initiatives for T&E OARs.


