EDUCATION AND TRAINING JOINT CROSS-SERVICE GROUP
MEETING MINUTES OF JANUARY 26, 2005

The Principal Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (P&R), Mr. Charles Abell, chaired the 43rd meeting of the E&T JCSG. Attendee List is at Attachment 1. The following is a brief summary of the discussions:

- The Ranges Subgroup (Mr. Tom Macia) briefed three scenarios for E&T JCSG consideration. The E&T JCSG:
 - ***Approved E&T JCSG scenario 0037, “Joint Range Coordination Center East” and scenario 0038, “Joint Range Coordination Center West”.***
Subgroup expanded justification to include the capabilities these companion scenarios bring to the Department of Defense as requested at the 19 Jan E&T JCSG meeting.
 - ***Deactivated E&T JCSG scenario 0051, “RW Air Launched Munitions T&E OAR Workload to China Lake.”*** Given there is no payback, there is no technical or financial reason to assume risk associated with movement of open air range test program capabilities associated with scenario.
 - Although the E&T JCSG Scenario 0010 “Joint Urban Operations Center” does not name a specific installation/location to stand-up a Joint Urban Operations Center; E&T JCSG urged the subgroup to begin looking at potential options to surface at the appropriate time.

- Professional Development Education (PDE) Subgroup (Col Lynes) briefed that the remaining candidate recommendations (PME/JPME) should be complete and ready to brief to the JCSG by 2 February. In previous sessions, existing MILCON projects for PME/JPME Institutions were pertinent only as avoided costs, if the institution moved as a result of BRAC action. It could not be included in a "physically stay-in-place" scenario. PDE subgroup had asked Services to review their POM through the FYDP. So far, the Services have reported “zero” dollars. Service representatives agreed to follow-up with their respective Services to verify the dollar amount. PDE is also working through the issue of Certified Scenario Data that they believe is incorrect based upon insights gained from the requirements of law & CJCS Policy, PAJE Visits, and Service Submissions to the JPMEII at SSC Implementation. PDE has opted to present both the certified data and data based on the subgroup’s military judgment. One scenario was briefed for E&T JCSG consideration. The E&T JCSG:
 - ***Deactivated E&T JCSG scenario 0015, “Establish Joint Center of Excellence for Legal SST/PDE functions (Maxwell AFB).”*** Analysis revealed no savings associated with this scenario. Additionally, the current location at Charlottesville offers 51 courses that are American Bar Association

certified. Current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) provides inexpensive leased space (>\$17/SF) and incorporates library and law program support within the lease costs. The proposed new location cannot easily meet these unique ABA-certified requirements.

The next scheduled meeting of the E&T JCSG is Thursday, January 27, 2005.

Justification (E&T 0037 and 0038)

- **Original E&T JCSG Guidance (Jul 03 Memo):**


- Integrate distributed/networked (live) virtual and constructive capabilities through JNTC initiative into regional and national centers.
- Guiding Principals: Advance Jointness; Achieve Synergy; Capitalize on Technology; Exploit Best Practices; Minimize Redundancy

- **Range Subgroup process for TNG Function:**

- 51 original proposals reflecting possible cross-service range combinations.
- Reduced to 2 scenarios representing a best structure for cross-service/cross-functional range use.

- **Supports the SECDEF's top priorities – Jointness, Transformation & T2.**

- Facilitates all large scale range use: joint, cross-functional, or service specific, to include JNTC.
 - Optimizes ground, air, and sea range space for both training and testing.
- Aids the implementation of the JNTC component of OSD's T2 JNTC objectives:
 - Ability to perform in Joint Context
 - Ability to provide a robust opposition force
 - Ability to measure through instrumentation
 - Ability to assess training
 - JNTC is the future measure for live, virtual and constructive Joint Training
- Facilitates JNTC events and joint tasks integrated into all live training.
- Leverages existing Service range staff with the additional work required to implement JNTC and the increased cross-service and cross-functional range use sought by OSD
- Provides enhanced situational awareness concerning the status, capabilities, and sustainability (e.g., encroachment, outreach and best management practices) of ranges across DoD. Mirrors other regional approaches, eg Army & Navy installation management; OSD Regional Environmental Offices.



- **Coordination Centers and Detachments:**

- Services retain specific Range functions (Scheduling, Management, Resource Management)
- Will enhance present Training or T&E range missions.
- Expands on and leverages existing formal and informal relationships.

- Developing JNTC Requirements
- Developing JNTC Plans and Objectives
- Coordinating scheduling of sites to support JNTC

Why BRAC? (E&T 0037 and 0038)

Why BRAC?

- Complies with E&T JCSG guidance (Memos dated 26 Jun and 2 Jul 03)
- A positive course of action that precipitates Cross-Service and Cross-Functional Range Use.
- Concept of Joint Range Complexes institutionalizes on-going JFCOM JNTC development.
- Ability to create, through BRAC, Joint Planning and Coordination staffs at highest value locations will enable required JNTC operational capability.
- This legislates a transformational management action.
- Ensures T2/JNTC capability through BRAC.
- Provides a resourcing solution that facilitates DoD T2 desired endstate.

Note: Legal review will determine if these are within the OSD BRAC guidance and parameters.

- The Charlottesville, VA Graduate Education Program and Continuing Legal Education (CLE) programs are American Bar Association (ABA) certified; both require access to Univ of Virginia Civilian Law Program and Associated Law Library facilities
- Current MOU with Univ. of Virginia provides inexpensive Leased Space (>\$17/SF) and incorporates library and law program support within the lease costs
- Maxwell AFB cannot easily meet these unique ABA-certified requirements; the cost is estimated to be much greater.
