



Command and Control Headquarters



Army Service Component Command – provides trained and ready Soldiers for the PACOM Commander.

Major Army Command – Organize, train, and equip Soldiers for prompt and sustained combat incident to operations on land.

Joint Force Headquarters for Homeland Defense – Commands and controls the Joint Force which protects the population and Homelands within the Pacific HLD Joint Operations Area.





missions in the Pacific.



- **PACOM Executive Agent for Geospatial Analysis.**

205th MI Bn

- **Only source of Measures and Sensor Intelligence (MASINT) analysis in PACOM.**
