

## **Co-locate Defense/Military Department Adjudication Activities**

### **Force Structure Capabilities**

**Force Structure Capabilities:** HSA JCSG built scenarios involving Major Administrative and HQs Activities to accommodate current and surge requirements. Since manpower levels remain generally stable through FY2011 within this Force & Infrastructure Category (F&IC) for all services, and end strength levels as reported in DoD's 20-year Force structure plan remain relatively flat, HSA JCSG assumes the 20-Year Force Structure Plan will have no impact on this scenario. Classified counterintelligence and intelligence strategic planning documents based on Director of Central Intelligence Planning Guidance and Defense Planning Guidance, and which are tied to DoD's 20-Year Force Structure Plan, are available for review upon request at the Technical Integration Center.

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### **Military Value Results**

**Military Value Analysis Results:** The military value of MILDEP and Defense adjudication activities in leased locations is between 0.4402 and 0.2719 with ranks ranging from 191 to 280 out of 334 total entities evaluated by the Major Administrative Headquarters military value model. The military value of MILDEP and Defense adjudication activities on installations is between 0.5413 and 0.4065 with ranks ranging from 152 to 197 out of 334 total entities. This recommendation selects a receiving location reflecting significant improvement in military value: Fort Meade, Maryland, has a value of 0.8445 with a relative rank of 94 out of 334 installations. 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### **Capacity Analysis**

**Capacity Analysis Results:** Initial major administrative headquarters' Capacity Analysis focused on gathering data across the Continental United States (CONUS). A summary table follows. The summary includes data which compare the total space currently on an installation or occupied by an Activity against what is required at an average space requirement of 200 Gross Square Feet per person, used as a means to estimate the shortfall or excess of space which may currently exist, after accounting for surge requirements.

Follow-on analysis focused on gathering data specific to adjudication activities.

The last table shows final Capacity Data, manpower reductions, movement, and space requirements attendant to this candidate recommendation.
