Subj: IMPLEMENTATION OF CHIEF OF NAVAL OPERATIONS (CNO)
GUIDANCE - GLOBAL WAR ON TERRORISM (GWOT) CAPABILITIES

Ref: (a) GWOT Working Group Power Point Brief of 07 Jun 05

(c) DOD Directive 1315.17 of 28 Apr 05

1. On 7 June 2005, the CNO directed the following actions to expand the Navy's capabilities to prosecute the GWOT as outlined in reference (a):

- a. Establish a Riverine Force in both the Active and Reserve Components. By 24 August 2005, OPNAV N6/N7 will, in coordination with OPNAV N8, N095 and CFFC, provide a plan to establish an AC riverine squadron in FY05/06 followed by the establishing two (2) RC riverine squadrons in FY-07/08.
- b. Establish a Reserve Civil Affairs Battalion in the SEABEES. By 24 August 2005, OPNAV N4 will, in coordination with OPNAV N095, CFFC and First Naval Construction Division, provide a plan to establish a provisional Reserve Civil Affairs Unit in FY-06 and Reserve Civil Affairs Battalion by the end of FY-07.
- c. Active/Reserve Integration for HCS 4/5. CFFC will execute Active/Reserve Integration of ICS 4/5 in accordance with reference (b), "SOURCING OIF 2 EXORD MOD 015".
- d. Establishment of an Intelligence Data Mining capability at the National Maritime Intelligence Center (NMIC). By 31 July 2005, OPNAV N2 will provide a plan to establish an Intelligence Data Mining capability at the NMIC starting in FY-05. The plan should include hardware, software, manning, and resource requirements.
- e. Procurement of Automatic Identification Systems for surface ships. By 31 July 2005, OPNAV N6/N7 in coordination with CFFC and OPNAV N8 will develop a plan to procure and install stand-alone AIS for all surface ships by the end of FY-06. Procurement and installation should begin as soon as possible. The stand-alone system should be compatible with the N6/N7 PR-07 ISPP proposal for an integrated AIS/GCCS-M system.
- f. Establishment of MIO Intelligence Exploitation Team Pilot Program. By 31 July 2005, OPNAV N2 in coordination with

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(GWOT) CAPABILITIES

FFC will provide a plan to establish a pilot program for MIO Intelligence Exploitation Teams. The first group of personnel will be identified and commence training by September 2005. The plan will include methodology to assess the results of the pilot program and determine the way ahead.

g. Establishment of a FAO Community. In response to reference (c), OPNAV N3/N5 supported by OPNAV N1 will develop a plan to establish a Foreign Area Officer Community in FY-06 by 15 July 2005. Not later than 1 August 2005, OPNAV N1 in coordination with N3/N5 will provide an assessment of the availability of qualified personnel to support establishment of an Enhanced FAO Community.

h. Navy Expeditionary Sailor Battalion Concept Development. Deep Blue supported by OPNAV N1, N2, N4, N5, N6/N7, N8 and CFFC will refine the concept and develop a plan not later than 24 August 2005, to stand-up a Navy Expeditionary Combat Battalion in FY-07. CFFC will use the concept to develop a CONOPS.

i. Navy Expeditionary Training Team Concept. Deep Blue supported by OPNAV N1, N2, N4, N5, N6/7, N8 and CFFC will refine the concept and develop a plan to stand-up a Navy Expeditionary Training Team in FY-07. CFFC will use the concept to develop a CONOPS.

2. OPNAV N8 will ensure that the September budget change submission to the Office of Secretary of Defense reflects FY-2006 and FY-2007 changes as appropriate, to fully carry out these decisions, which has also been approved by (P) CNO.

3. To the extent possible, active and reserve endstrength, as reflected in the glideslope and zero-based review respectively should not grow. If necessary, growth should be noted by lead OPNAV code.

4. OPNAV organizations assigned primary responsibility for each of these action items will notify VCNO, via DNS, when actions are complete. DNS will schedule a VCNO corporate board in mid-August to review implementation status.

Dear Congressman Taylor:

This is in response to the August 4 and 5, 2005, inquiries from Mr. Stephen Peranich of your staff to CDR Paul Kiamos, USN, of the Navy Office of Legislative Affairs regarding Stennis Space Center. Mr. Peranich requested all Military Construction (MILCON), current projects and those programmed for future years, for all claimants and commands located at the Stennis Space Center, particularly any projects related to Special Operations Command (SOCOM). Additionally, he requested information concerning the type(s) of facilities that would be required to support the establishment of the three Riverine Squadrons (1 AC and 2 RC) described in the CNO's directive of 6 July 05. Our responses have been coordinated with Commander, Fleet Forces Command, Naval Facilities Engineering Command and Commander Navy Installations.

Recently completed MILCONS at Stennis Space Center:

- 1998 - Q100 - Special Operations Forces Operations and Maintenance Facility - \$9.9M
- 1999 - Q110 - Special Operations Forces Operations Support Facility - \$5.5M
- 2000 - Q130 - Special Operations Forces Relocate Naval Small Craft Instruction and Technology Training - \$9.6M

On going MILCONS at Stennis Space Center:

- 2003 - P140 - Special Operations Forces Small Craft Training Range - \$5M

PB06 Programmed MILCONS at Stennis Space Center:

- 2011 - Q210 - Special Operation Forces Special Boat Team 22 Combatant Craft Range Operations Facility - \$6M

Facilities in support of Riverine Squadrons:

Thank you for your interest in the establishment of a Riverine Force as it supports the implementation of the CNO's direction to expand the Navy's capabilities to prosecute the Global War on Terrorism. As you are aware, the CNO's directive of 6 July 05 laid a framework within the Navy to achieve this objective and the associated facility design or requirements you requested are simply not available at this time. A notional description of the concept of operations (CONOPS) is currently being developed and will be

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reviewed and refined over the next few months. Once this CONOPS and the associated facility requirements are out of this infancy stage, we will be more than happy to share them with you. We are well aware of the outstanding contributions that Stennis has made to the success of the SBT-22 and NAVSCIATTS and will most assuredly take the capabilities of Stennis into account as we develop the long range employment plans.
