Synopsis of Discussion Items:

Review 4 April 2005 Minutes

- The JAST reviewed and approved the 4 April 2005 JAST Meeting Minutes.

Review status of scenario ideas

- The JAST reviewed and reconciled the status of all 114 JAST scenario ideas
- **A015.** The Navy representative reported that the DON deliberative body determined this scenario idea has insufficient return on investment for Navy. Therefore, Navy has withdrawn its participation. Since Army intends to move onto USAF property, scenario idea remains "joint" with Army/USAF participation. USAF and Army have coordinated space requirements.
- **A030.** The Navy representative reported that the DON deliberative body determined this scenario idea has insufficient return on investment for Navy. Therefore, Navy has withdrawn its participation. Since there is no joint MILDEP participation, the JAST closed **A030** and referred it back to Army.
- **A065.** The Navy representative reported that the DON deliberative body determined this scenario idea has insufficient return on investment for Navy. Therefore, Navy has withdrawn its participation. Since there is no joint MILDEP participation, the JAST closed **A065** and referred it back to Army. Navy reported that it intends to submit Navy only recommendation (DON-0017a) in lieu of participating in **A065**.

JAST documentation for MILDEPs' BRAC report

- The JAST agreed that each MILDEP's BRAC report should address how it participated in the JAST process and suggested using the Joint Action Scenario Development Plan as a frame of reference.

JAST Report and files

- The JAST discussed whether OSD or the Army should maintain the JAST records. The OSD representative suggested the Army, as JAST lead, should retain a copy of JAST records and a copy of the JAST records should be provided to OSD (the copy provided to OSD will become the archive input for BRAC 2005 JAST).

Recommendations:

1. The MILDEPs finalize all JAST scenario ideas.
2. Each MILDEP include in their BRAC Report a brief description of how it participated in the JAST process.
3. The Army retain copy of JAST documentation it its BRAC supporting documentation and provide a copy to OSD BRAC Office.
4. The JAST members update their BRAC Directors on status of JAST scenario ideas and results of 11 April meeting.
