Review 4 October 2004 Minutes

- JAST concurred with 4 October 2004 Minutes as written.

Review JAST Scenario Ideas

- New Scenario Ideas.
 - The Army submitted four (4) new joint operational basing scenario ideas (JAST #A079 – #A082). The JAST reviewed the scenario ideas and assigned the Services' Points of Contact.
 - The JAST noted that the Army had inadvertently entered the scenario ideas cited above in the ISG tracker prior to the JAST reviewing them. The Army will scrub all of its entries to determine if any other scenario ideas need to be reviewed by the JAST.

- Feedback from MILDEP BRAC Directors.
 - Navy recommendations were not available at the time of the JAST meeting. However, the Navy will provide its recommendations immediately following the meeting and the JAST will review them during its next JAST.

- IAW with the Joint Action Scenario Development Process Plan the JAST will CLOSE JAST# A039, A070, and A078 and refer them back to the Army. JAST #A057, however, will remain OPEN pending Navy’s recommendation.
- The JAST reviewed the status of all JAST Scenario Ideas. It was noted that #A001, A035, A036, and A037 had previously been referred to the appropriate JCSG for consideration and therefore have been CLOSED as JAST scenario ideas.

- Scenario Analysis Process
 - The JAST conducted a detailed discussion on how the MILDEPS should conduct their portions of the analyses, coordinate with the other Services, and enter their scenarios into the ISG tracking tool. The JAST agreed to continue discussion of process details in future JAST meetings and provide recommendations to the MILDEP BRAC Directors.

Next Steps

- The JAST will continue to meet, follow up on current scenario ideas, review new scenario ideas, and discuss the scenario analysis process.

Decisions:

- The JAST will meet during the week of 18 October 2004. It will continue to review, coordinate, monitor progress, and assist information flow on joint scenario ideas, and provide feedback from their BRAC Directors.

Recommendations:

1. BRAC Directors continue to review the joint scenario ideas presented to the JAST and direct “further study” or “no further study” and inform their JAST members of their decisions.
2. JAST continue fleshing out process methodology details at next JAST meeting.
