Synopsis of Discussion Items:

Review 13 December 2004 Minutes

- JAST approved the 13 December 2004 Minutes.

New Ideas

- The Navy presented one (1) new scenario idea, #N018. The JAST members reviewed the idea and assigned Navy and USAF Points of Contact for further study. The USAF JAST representative confirmed by email that the USAF BRAC Director recommends "further study" of the scenario idea with the Navy.

Status update of current ideas

- The Army and Navy JAST representatives provided an update of their follow-on meeting to review the fourteen (14) Navy and one (1) USMC ideas submitted on 13 December. Twelve (12) of the Navy ideas reflect no requirement for a "joint study" (rather were presented to the JAST for information and coordination with the other MILDEPs). The Navy is considering moving Navy elements (mostly RC) out of Army or USAF property to

Navy facilities elsewhere. The JAST discussed the issues pertaining the facilities, costs, ownership, etc, if a tenant Service vacates a host Service's installation.

- Other updates:
 - N016 – Navy and USAF BRAC Directors recommend further study.
 - N017 – Army and Navy BRAC Directors recommend further study.
 - N018 – Navy and USAF BRAC Directors recommend further study.
 - MC005 – Army and Navy BRAC Directors recommend further study; Army further recommends incorporating this scenario idea into JAST# A032.

Feedback from Navy and USAF on recommended process methodology

- Navy confirmed that it concurs with using the Common Space Reduction Tool (CRST) in studying JAST RC scenarios.
- Army and Navy JAST representatives reported their respective BRAC Directors have agreed in principal to the process methodology for conducting COBRA analyses, integration, and cost/savings and the BRAC analysts are actively working the scenarios.

Other Issues

- JAST recommends the Army and Navy assess the impact of Navy scenario ideas that involve Navy tenant elements moving out of Army host installations.

Decisions:

- JAST members will update their BRAC Directors on status of scenarios and issues discussed.
- Army and Navy RC BRAC analysts will assess impact of Navy scenario ideas that involve Navy tenant elements moving out of Army host installations and update their respective BRAC Directors.

Recommendations;

1. Army and Navy provide feedback to their BRAC Directors and update at the next JAST meeting.
2. JAST meet Monday, 3 January 2005.
