Subj: COORDINATION OF MEDICAL AND INDUSTRIAL JOINT CROSS SERVICE  
GROUPS' FINAL CAPACITY ANALYSIS REPORTS

In response to your 16 December 2003 request for review of the subject reports, concur with the following comments:

- The capacity questions included with the reports attached to the 16 December request for review underwent significant refinement and change in ensuing weeks. These changes largely were for the purpose of clarifying, eliminating duplications, and filling minor gaps in the data call questions.
- While the Industrial report states that outloading capability will be a metric for the munitions and armaments deployment network, no questions address this issue. Use of selected Supply and Storage JCSG data questions will help bridge this gap. Additional questions are anticipated during the military value data call to cover this disparity.
- Final Industrial JCSG questions relating to maintenance of weapons and munitions do not clearly differentiate between non-energetic components of interest to the Maintenance sub-group and energetic components of interest to the Munitions and Armaments sub-group. This needs to be clarified in order to ensure that the intended data is captured.

This response has been coordinated with the Vice Chief of Naval Operations and Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps.
