SUBJECT: Testimony Correction

Reference: BRAC Hearing on Recommendations and Methodology (US Air Force), 17 May 2005

The following is a correction to my testimony concerning the number of centrifuges within the Air Force and has been coordinated with the Medical Joint Cross Service Group.

Original Testimony:

Mr. Coyle asked if the Air Force was proposing to disestablish the high-onset gravitational force centrifuge at Holloman AFB and move it to a different location, or will the Air Force no longer have this kind of centrifuge capability?

I answered that the Air Force currently has two centrifuges, and they were going to have one under the BRAC recommendation from the Medical Joint Cross Service Group.

Correction:

The Air Force currently has three centrifuges: one each at Wright-Patterson AFB, Brooks AFB, and Holloman AFB. The BRAC recommendation of the Medical Joint Cross Service Group moves the centrifuge at Brooks AFB to Wright-Patterson AFB and mothballs the centrifuge at Holloman AFB. The Medical Joint Cross Service Group analysis indicates that the two centrifuges at Wright-Patterson AFB will be sufficient of sufficient capacity for the Air Force's centrifuges requirements.
