I have confidence that you will take your duties as a BRAC commissioner very seriously and consider all of the factors involved in your decision. I am also confident that Cannon will be recommended for removal from the BRAC list after you have weighed all of the information at your disposal. The past history of Cannon and its involvement with past war time and peacekeeping duties shows the value and importance of Cannon. No other major Air Force Base has a better combination of flight weather, airspace, little electromagnetic interference, excellent air traffic control and suitability for flight training. In regards to the encroachment issue, we do not have such an encroachment issue here in the Clovis-High Plains area. There will be a huge economic impact on the local community and a great cost expense in regards to the recent privatization of housing for Cannon personnel and also with the relocation expense of the equipment and personnel.

Thank you for allowing my input in this matter and I look forward to hearing your commission's recommendation that Cannon be removed from the BRAC closure list.
