Where We Are


- **12 Jul 1994 – DCSOPS approved The Army Stationing Strategy Supported BRAC95**
- **5 Sep 01 - Current Stationing Strategy approved by LTG Ellis**
- **Jan-Feb 03 - Weekly meetings with the DASA(IA) to ensure BRAC nuances properly addressed**
- **Mar 03 – Revised Stationing Strategy staffed with DAMO-ZT, DAMO-SS and DAMO-TR**
- **Apr 03 - Obtained DCS, G-3 guidance on revised Stationing Strategy**
- **May 03 - Hosted MACOM/ARSTAF meeting to commence formal staffing process**
- **Jul 03 – Formal staffing process completed (DUAS(IA) reviewed final product)**
- **Aug 03 – Revised Stationing Strategy on G3's desk for approval**

Strategy drives force structure drives stationing.

2003 Army Stationing Strategy

- ❑ **Vision:** Units and functions located at installations (to include leased facilities) that enable the capabilities of a transforming Army and enhance the well-being of Army soldiers, civilians, retirees, veterans, and their families in the most efficient way, while preserving the Army's ability to fight and win the Nation's wars.
- ❑ **Mission:** Station Army forces and functions at installations capable of supporting Army Transformation and the DPG.
- ❑ **Goal:** Station Army units at installations to meet the demands of the DPG and fulfill the Army's Title 10 responsibilities in the most efficient and effective manner.
- ❑ **Premise:** Stationing is based on the capabilities of the installation, not the primary function performed at the installation.
- ❑ **Installations:** Grouped into 13 broad categories:

Army 2003 Stationing Strategy

□ *Principles:*

- Provide sustainable facilities to support a trained and ready Objective Force.
- Operate effectively at high levels of efficiency.
- Maintain flexibility to respond to new missions and functions.
- Provide minimum footprint consistent with military effectiveness and flexibility.
- Maintain forward presence at levels consistent with the DPGS.
- Consider environmental impacts of stationing and training.
- Provide mobilization capability.
- Provide suitable facilities and a safe, secure working environment to promote superior quality of life for all assigned forces.

□ *Evaluation Criteria:*

- Ability to support current/future mission requirements and contingencies
- Impacts on operational readiness
- Force protection
- Capacity utilization
- Mobilization requirements
- Environmental impacts
- Cost (Net Present Value and pay back) and manpower (military and civilian)




Strategy drives force structure drives stationing.

What The Army's 2003 Stationing Strategy Does

- **Provides the operational context for BRAC05 planning and analysis.**
 - **BRAC 05 selection criteria can be mapped back to the stationing principles.**
 - **BRAC 05 metrics can be derived from the 2003 Stationing Strategy**
- **Permits the Army to balance various and competing interests to ensure BRAC recommendations are developed without incurring unacceptable risks.**
- ***Supports total Army requirements, not just BRAC.***
 - **DUSA(IA) must develop a separate strategy document to govern its work.**
 - **Document has its roots in the 2003 Army Stationing Strategy.**
