Stationing Strategy

Past Events/Projected Timeline

- 12 Jul 1994 – DCSOPS approved The Army Stationing Strategy
Supported BRAC95
- 5 Sep 01 - Current Stationing Strategy approved by LTG Ellis
Used to support VCSA tasker – Army wide structure & stationing analysis
- Jan-Feb 03 - Weekly meetings with the DASA(IA) to ensure BRAC nuances properly addressed
- Mar 03 - Staffed with DAMO-ZT, DAMO-SS and DAMO-TR
- Apr 03 - Obtain DCS, G-3 guidance (expectation -- late April timeframe)
- May 03 - Host MACOM/ARSTAF meeting to commence staffing process
- Aug 03 – Obtain G3 approval of revised Strategy

Will be used to support BRAC05

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
2003 Stationing Strategy

(proposed)

- ❑ **Vision:** Units and functions located at installations (to include leased facilities) that enable the capabilities of a transforming Army and enhance the well-being of Army soldiers, civilians, retirees, veterans, and their families in the most efficient way, while preserving the Army's ability to fight and win the Nation's wars.
- ❑ **Mission:** Station Army forces and functions at installations capable of supporting Army Transformation and the DPG.
- ❑ **Goal:** Station Army units at installations to meet the demands of the DPG and fulfill the Army's Title 10 responsibilities in the most efficient and effective manner.
- ❑ **Premise:** Stationing is based on the capabilities of the installation, not the primary function performed at the installation.
- ❑ **Installations:** Grouped into 13 broad categories:

- Maneuver
- Major Training (Collective)
- Command/Control/Admin
- Training (Individual)
- Professional Development
- Medical Treatment
- Ports

- Ammunition Production
- Ammunition Storage
- Depots
- Industrial
- RDT&E
- Proving Grounds

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2003 Stationing Strategy

(proposed) (cont)

□ *Principles:*

- Provide sustainable facilities to support a trained and ready Objective Force.
- Operate effectively at high levels of efficiency.
- Maintain flexibility to respond to new missions and functions.
- Provide minimum footprint consistent with military effectiveness and flexibility.
- Maintain forward presence at levels consistent with the DPG.
- Consider environmental impacts of stationing and training.
- Provide mobilization capability.
- Provide suitable facilities and a safe, secure working environment to promote superior quality of life for all assigned forces.

□ *Evaluation Criteria:*

- Ability to support current/future mission requirements and contingencies
- Impacts on operational readiness
- Force protection
- Capacity utilization
- Mobilization requirements
- Environmental impacts
- Cost (Net Present Value and pay back) and manpower (military and civilian)




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The Army's Stationing Strategy
