

**BRAC 2005**  
**Technical Joint Cross-Service Group (TJCSG)**  
**Daily Conference Call**  
**Meeting Minutes of 28 March 2005**

Mr. Shaffer chaired the meeting. The agenda is enclosed in attachment 1. The list of attendees is enclosed in attachment 2. Read ahead materials for the meeting are enclosed in attachment 3. The primary objective for the meeting was to review the progress of Candidate Recommendations (CR) TECH-0059, 0005, 0006, 0042AR, 0032 and 0060. Also, the TJCSG was to continue deliberations on TECH-0014. The agenda topics are listed below in the order in which they were covered. The key points, decisions and action items from the meeting are as follows:

TECH-0014

**Key Points:**

- A TJCSG member recommended going forward with the medium bounded COBRA scenario. (No FFRDCs but with a \$200M risk factor.) It was noted however that the TJCSG had previously agreed to bound the functional COBRA analysis by running it with and without the FFRDC since there is a policy issue regarding whether or not the FFRDC should be included.
- In the previous telecon, three Principals said there would not be sufficient transformational value to overcome the large disparity in quantitative MV in moving the mission at Los Angeles AFB to Peterson AFB. Two indicated there would be transformational value in moving it. Issue still in work.

**Decisions:**

- The TJCSG tasked the ALSS Subgroup to draft the response to Mr. Wynne's memo for the ISG showing the complete COBRA analysis (ie, high, medium and low) for review by the TJCSG.
- The TJCSG will forward the functional COBRA results and technical data to the Air Force to support its analysis of USAF-0013, along with answers to the Air Force questions.

TECH-0059 Progress-Status Update

**Key Points:**

- A TJCSG member proposed having the Weapons and Armaments (W&A) Subgroup run a higher and lower bounded COBRA run.
- The Navy does not support the CR.
- The only unresolved assumption is what cost to apply to the square footage.

- The TJCSG previously deliberated to retain Indian Head as a specialty site. The TJCSG needs to determine if there is compelling rationale for overturning the previous deliberation.

**Decisions:**

- The W&A Subgroup was tasked to present the associated issue with the disagreement on the square footage assumption at tomorrow's, 29 March 2005, TJCSG Meeting. The TJCSG will then decide whether it makes sense to proceed with the closure of Indian Head.
