I am writing to the proposed closing of Cannon Air Force Base, Clovis, New Mexico. It has been pointed out by several publications that this round of base closing has more to do with politics than it does with the security of the country or the efficiency of the Military. This makes me both sad and angry, because I would like to think that the welfare of the people comes before the welfare of the politicians. The politicians do not live on the level of normal citizens. They are in the higher up class of society and I tend to think that they do not realize the consequences of their actions, either to the military personnel or to the communities involved.

I believe that it would be a great loss to the military and to the safety and security of our country, if Cannon Air Force Base was to close.

Clovis is a small farming and ranching community, population of about 31,000, and there is very little industry. Most of the businesses are small locally owned businesses, with some franchise business, but they are few. To lose the employment provided by Cannon AFB would be devastating to this small community and surrounding areas. The closing would send this community into a recession due to the income the base generates into the community.

I cannot fathom what your thinking could cause this community upon your decision of the closure of Cannon Air Force Base. The cost of closing and relocating the base, plus all air force military personnel, in my opinion, would be so much more then what it would be if you did not close Cannon AFB.

Plus, if you close the base, what is to happen to the base facilities and base housing that has been built in Clovis and the surrounding communities? Will facilities just be allowed to sit unoccupied and fall into disrepair or will the Air Force be responsible for the upkeep until the lease expires or is there

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What about the military people that are stationed at CAFB, that are fighting to protect our country in war torn countries, what are they supposed to think. Don't they already have enough on their minds, defending our country, without having to worry about whether the base where they and their family are stationed, will close, and their family will have to be moved while they are out protecting our country! Will they have to add to their worries of whether the military will have to construct additional facilities at another base to accommodate them and their families? Meanwhile Cannon falls down around us? How could this possibly be less expensive for the Government than using what is already available? Where military personnel are already established in the facilities provided to them at Cannon Air Force Base!

As a concerned citizen of Clovis, I ask that you and all the members of the BRAC Commission come to Clovis and the surrounding communities to see first hand what you are proposing. It is a great concern to this area that Cannon remain in operation. This part of New Mexico already has a high rate of unemployment, and I feel this should be one of the considerations before a final decision is made. It seems extreme that we should suffer the highest rate of personnel and job loss of any place in the entire United States.

Because of Cannon Air Force Base, our community has grown in leaps and bounds, not only in businesses, but also in community relations. Base personnel have become family, one of us. They have become members of our community, church families, and schools. Without them, part of our family unit will be missing.

Please reconsider your decision. May God bless you in your discerning process of making wise decisions for the well being of our community and our country.
